The Book of Joel

"Joel draws on centuries of Israelite tradition in the framing of his message. Principally, he uses the tradition, familiar from earlier prophecy, of the day of the Lord, as well as those of the enemy from the north and of the judgment on foreign nations. Sometimes he borrows whole sentences from earlier prophets. Sometimes he appropriates smaller word groups. But Joel's prophecy is not a stereotyped word from the past. Rather, it is a forceful, sometimes eloquent testimony to the continued working of the prophetic word in history. Not only through immediate revelation to him, but also through the words of earlier prophets, Joel hears God speaking to Judah's present situation. He believes that much foretold in past prophecy has not yet been fulfilled and that the fulfillment is not only being worked out in his time but also stretches on into the future. Indeed, the future that he envisions reaches also into our time and gives to Joel's prophecies their pertinence for our lives." -Elizabeth Achtemeier, "Joel: Introduction, Commentary, and Reflections," in The New Interpreter's Bible Commentary (Nashville: Abingdon Press, 1996), VII: 302.
